Category	Description
High Dosage Tutoring	Students' schedules will reflect daily tutoring in both reading and math. This will be provided throughout the day on a rotating basis. The additional dose will be aligned to the current classroom content. This will be done at all grade levels. This will be provided on a daily basis with no more than 3-4 in a group. Teachers will receive ongoing PD and adjustments will be made as necessary. There will be a total of 21 interventionist hired. There will be 5 placed at each elementary school for a total of 15 and 2 placed at each high school for an additional 6.
Summer Reading Camps	Summer reading camps will be held at each elementary school for K-3 students identified with reading deficiency per the Alabama Literacy Act. Guidelines provided by ARI will be followed. It will be held 4 days a week, June 7th through July 1st, for a total of 76 hours. Breakfast and lunch will be provided.
Credit Recovery Options	Credit recovery will be offered through our high school computer labs and a facilitator will monitor student progress and provide assistance where needed. The program used will be Odysseyware.
Nurses	Assist in funding nurses for each school. State funds will be depleted and ESSER funds will be used to secure a nurse at each campus.
Other Instructional Coaches	Assist in funding instructional reading specialists for each K-3 school in the district. State funds will be depleted and ESSER funds will be used to secure a specialist at each school. We will also be funding a math coach for one of our schools to target students who need additional support.
Other Teachers and Aides	Dedicated Attention: Additional teachers and instructional aides will be hired to address significant learning loss. Fewer students per teacher will increase the quality of learning and teaching. Aides will provide explicit small group remediation to address specific student needs.
